

## CLINICAL AUDIT

The clinical audit must be undertaken during clinical training and completed by the end of Intermediate training, before a trainee can progress to Advanced training.

The clinical audit must be relevant to urology and be conducted according to the Revised Standards for Quality Improvement Reporting Excellence ([SQUIRE-2 Guidelines](#)).

Trainees must first identify an Audit Supervisor who will be responsible for overseeing the audit's completion. The Audit Supervisor must sign the *Clinical Audit Proposal* form to confirm their agreement to supervise the audit.

Trainees are required to submit the *Clinical Audit Proposal* form during Basic training to their Regional QI and Research Advisor, before starting the audit.

Once the audit is completed, trainees must submit the audit as a journal manuscript to their Regional QI and Research Advisor for approval. If feedback is provided, the trainee must revise the manuscript accordingly and re-submit it for approval.

After the manuscript is approved, trainees must submit their audit for presentation at a USANZ Section Meeting or the USANZ Annual Scientific Meeting (podium presentation, selected based on merit).

To progress from Intermediate to Advanced Training, a completed *Presentation Evaluation* Form must also be submitted.
