



CLINICAL AUDIT

The clinical audit must be undertaken during clinical training and completed by the end of Intermediate training, before a trainee can progress to Advanced training.

The clinical audit must be relevant to urology and be conducted according to the Revised Standards for Quality Improvement Reporting Excellence (SQUIRE-2 Guidelines).

Trainees must first identify an Audit Supervisor who will be responsible for overseeing the audit's completion. The Audit Supervisor must sign the *Clinical Audit Proposal* form to confirm their agreement to supervise the audit.

Trainees are required to submit the *Clinical Audit Proposal* form during Basic training to their Regional QI and Research Advisor, before starting the audit.

Once the audit is completed, trainees must submit the audit as a journal manuscript to their Regional QI and Research Advisor for approval. If feedback is provided, the trainee must revise the manuscript accordingly and resubmit it for approval.

After the manuscript is approved, trainees must submit their audit for presentation at a USANZ Section Meeting or the USANZ Annual Scientific Meeting (podium presentation, selected based on merit).

To progress from Intermediate to Advanced Training, a completed *Presentation Evaluation* Form must also be submitted.

The flowchart below outlines the steps for completion of the Clinical Audit.

Identify an Audit Supervisor to oversee the audit. Audit Supervisor signs the Clinical Audit Proposal form.



Submit Clinical Audit Proposal form to Regional QI and Research Advisor before starting the audit.



Complete and submit audit as a journal manuscript to the Regional QI and Research Advisor for approval.



Revise manuscript based on feedback and re-submit for approval.



Submit abstract of approved audit for presentation at a USANZ Section Meeting or the USANZ Annual Scientific Meeting (podium presentation).



Present audit as a podium presentation and submit a completed *Presentation Evaluation* Form.
