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## CLINICAL AUDIT

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The clinical audit must be completed while undertaking clinical training, or a during an interruption from training, which has been approved by the Board of Urology, for the purposes of research.

The clinical audit must be completed by the end of Intermediate training (i.e., before the trainee can progress to Advanced training).

The clinical audit must be relevant to urology and conducted according to the Revised Standards for Quality Improvement Reporting Excellence ([SQUIRE-2 Guidelines](#)).

Trainees must identify an Audit Supervisor who will be responsible for overseeing the completion of the audit. The Audit Supervisor must sign the *Clinical Audit Proposal* form to confirm that they have agreed to oversee the audit to completion.

Trainees must submit a *Clinical Audit Proposal* form during Basic training, to their respective Regional Training Chairperson (or nominee), prior to commencement.

Trainees must submit their completed audit(s) in the form of a journal manuscript, to the Quality Improvement (QI) Research Committee for approval.

Any feedback received by the QI and Research Committee must be actioned by the trainee, and the revised manuscript re-submitted to the QI and Research Committee for approval.

Trainees must submit their audit for presentation to a USANZ Section Meeting or Annual Scientific Meeting. A satisfactory signed *Presentation Evaluation Form* must be submitted to progress from Intermediate to Advanced Training.
