Re: Post Fellowship Education & Training (PFET) Program in Transplantation Surgery in (2026)

The GSA Transplant Training Committee invites applicants to apply to the Post Fellowship Education & Training (PFET) Program in Transplantation Surgery.

The PFET Program in Transplantation Surgery is for Urology Surgeons. The program consists of two years Education and Training in Transplantation Surgery, following successful completion of the Fellowship Examination and SET Program requirements in Urology Surgery.

A portion of the program will include clinical research. Trainees will be awarded the Australian and New Zealand Certificate of Post Fellowship Education and Training in Transplantation Surgery following satisfactory completion of the curriculum requirements, completion of research requirements, a minimum of twenty four months clinical training, successful case load achievement and assessments, plus attendance of at least one Frontiers and Challenges in Transplantation (FACT) Update Course of the Transplantation Society of Australia and New Zealand (TSANZ).

All trainees and Fellows who have successfully completed the Fellowship Examination in Urology Surgery or trainees who are registered to sit in May (2025) and have appropriate medical registration are eligible to apply for the PFET Program in Transplantation Surgery. There will be a selection process and all eligible applicants will be considered by the GSA Transplant Training Committee. Interviews for the (2026) PFET Program in Transplantation Surgery will be held in **June 2025 via Zoom (date & time TBC)**, and successful applicants will be notified by the GSA Transplant Training Committee.
